


I was asked to say a few words about the work with data management plans in Stockholm University's research management team, before Joakim gets into the technical side of our work.

At Stockholm University, we strive towards a university-wide research support. The research management team is coordinated at the university library and includes staff from the library, archive, the IT department, the grants office and we also have access to legal expertise. At the library, a team of 4-5 people take part in the research data management work.

The SU research data policy was accepted in 2018 but SUB staff has worked with services to support researchers in their management, storage, publication and archiving of data since 2016. We have created material for the SU website for students and scholars, given lectures and seminars and made department visits. This is a screen shot of our website, summarizing the support we offer. With regards to data repositories and curation, we curate data deposits into SND, figshare, zenodo and dataverse.

And finally, of course, as is the topic of today: we offer researchers help set up DMPs.



Since 2016, we recommend DMPonline to our researchers. <a href="https://dmp.su.se/">https://dmp.su.se/</a> is the SU space. SU researchers are logged in using their SU credentials. DMPonline is, as you know, a digital tool to create, review and share data management plans. We have licenced access to DMPonline until 2021, and await the news of a national developed and recommended DMP tool.

While waiting, we plan to make local adjustments in the tool to help better guide our researchers.

We saw an increase in users during 2019, when the Swedish Research Council started to formally request DMPs. To date 98 users have set up 121 DMPs. We expect a continued increase as more and more Swedish funders request DMPs.

Further work:

We plan to produce accessible, recorded bite-size material on DMPs on our website. Also. Starting 2021 – if all formalities go well - we will offer a higher education credits awarding course in OS to doctoral students. This is done in collaboration with the faculty of humanities. This course will, of course, include good data management and DMPs.
